JOHN KØRNER: War Problems

War Problems is a new series of sixteen large-scale works, each representing a Danish soldier killed in Afghanistan and each bearing a single name. The sixteen paintings do not exist as portraits of the individual soldiers nor as documentation of the actual events of their deaths, but rather function as a collective expression of the human tragedy imparted by this war.

John Kørner has long referred to his paintings as 'problems': playful explorations of the medium's duality its physical presence and its descriptive power. Here, these 'problems' of war offer up a visual encounter as well as open up space for the continuation of debates around current international conflicts.

An established artist who has been shown extensively internationally, this represents his second solo show at Victoria Miro, one of London's leading commercial galleries.
